Dear Reader, My champion of justice husband, John Conner, died in my arms August 18 after courageously dealing with multiple health problems. I received dozens

of beautiful condolence messages from his enormous network of friends and am publishing them (plus those from my own friends) on our Messages pages.

I'm going to be selling our home and moving back to New Jersey where my family lives. In clearing out his desk, I found two notes I'd like to share with you.

First, he had saved a little book I had given him years ago called I Love You Because: and inside I had written, "...you give your all to make the world a better place."

Second, he had also saved another little book I had given him in 2000 called *True Love: How to Make Your Relationship Sweeter, Deeper, and More Passionate.* Inside that one I found these notes in his bold handwriting:

1. Lifelong loving relationship.

2. Rich and full lives and worthwhile.

3. Grow together in our quest for Justice and Truth.

4. Respond to physical and spiritual needs.

5. Work together till environmental justice comes.

I invited our friends to come to our home the weekend after his death and made a display on the mantle over our fireplace of some of my favorite photos and reminders of his life. You'll find those pictures inside here, too.

Now that he's gone and I'm nearly 74, you cannot imagine the joy and relief I find in Greta and all the younger people springing wholeheartedly into the climate movement, including most of you. For the Earth Always,

I'll be eager to see what you submit. Thanks so much.

### Fair Use Law: https://copyright.gov/fair-use/more-info.html

Fair use is a legal doctrine that promotes freedom of expression by permitting the unlicensed use of copyright-protected works in certain circumstances. Section 107 of the Copyright Act provides the statutory framework for determining whether something is a fair use and identifies certain types of uses such as criticism, comment, news reporting, teaching, scholarship, and research—as examples of activities that may qualify as fair use. Section 107 calls for consideration of the following four factors in evaluating a question of fair use:

(1) Purpose and character of the use, including whether the use is of a commercial nature or is for nonprofit educational purposes: Courts look at how the party claiming fair use is using the copyrighted work and are more likely to find that nonprofit educational and noncommercial uses are fair. This does not mean, however, that all nonprofit education and noncommercial uses are fair and all commercial uses are not fair; instead, courts will balance the purpose and character of the use against the other factors below. Additionally, "transformative" uses are more likely to be considered fair. Transformative uses are those that add something new, with a further purpose or different character, and do not substitute for the original use of the work.

(2) Nature of the copyrighted work: This factor analyzes the degree to which the work that was used relates to copyright's purpose of encouraging creative expression....

(3) Amount and substantiality of the portion used in relation to the copyrighted work as a whole: Under this factor, courts look at both the quantity and quality of the copyrighted material that was used. If the use includes a large portion of the copyrighted work, fair use is less likely to be found; if the use employs only a small amount of copyrighted material, fair use is more likely....

(4) Effect of the use upon the potential market for or value of the copyrighted work: Here, courts review whether, and to what extent, the unlicensed use harms the existing or future market for the copyright owner's original work. In assessing this factor, courts consider whether the use is hurting the current market for the original work (for example, by displacing sales of the original) and/or whether the use could cause substantial harm if it were to become widespread....

I met John August 26, 1989 when I was giving an environmental talk at a conference at the ocean for children in a summer program. I was working for the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and had become a spokewoman for the Bureau of Community Relations. We had a mutual friend who wanted us to meet.

After the program, John and I walked along the shoreline talking excitedly about our work. He had started the Ecumenical Coallition for Peace and Justice Throughout the World. Who couldn't love that?

We had a few complications. He had a girlfriend and I had a husband but we fell in love anyhow, untangled ourselves, and I moved to Maryland to be with him May 11, 1990. We had an environmental wedding July 28, 1990 and started the stillexisting Grassroots Coalition for Environmental and Economic Justice non-profit 501(c)(3).

I was amazed at his passion, vision, energy, dedication, brilliance, and enthusiasm for working tirelessly to make this world a better place in every single way he could think of. His goal was to create a processs based on people globally forming Social Justice Communities so that members working hard under daunting circumstances would have the moral support of their friends, thus increasing their power.

John's health is failing. He has endured years of medical treatment and struggled to keep his vision alive. That is all ending now and I already miss him.

Here's is his brief biography.

#### John Conner's Past (written by John)

**Jesuits.** I spent the first 16 years (1953-1970) of my adult life in the Society of Jesus, where my principal focus was theology. I taught in high school in Baltimore, Philadelphia, and Washington and in college in Scranton.

**Housing Department in Baltimore.** After I left the Jesuits I spent 10 years working in the inner city of Baltimore, overseeing the implementation of projects funded by

the Federal Government (Community Development Block Grant funds). The other City Departments did not go out into the community for regular meetings as the Housing Department did (twice a week), so in effect I represented the City and tried to help people with their needs from all City Departments.

**Cold War.** In 1982 I read a book about nuclear war, *The Fate of the Earth* by Jonathan Schell, and was so appalled that I left my job and sold my house and began to facilitate exchanges between American and Soviet people, hoping to undermine the hostility between the two governments. I organized several exchanges between Baltimore and its sister city in the Soviet Union, Odessa, with the help of the U.S. State Department, and facilitated collaboration among many U.S. cities with sister cities in the Soviet Union.

**Economic Injustice.** As the Cold War was winding down in the late 1980s, I began to read political science, economics, and sociology, in order to learn how the world really works. I began to see that the people who run the major corporations have an inordinate say in what goes on in this country. So my wife and I decided to focus on one area of the economy, the clothing industry, and we began to go to churches and colleges in the Northeast, Mid-Atlantic, and Midwest, urging people to switch from sweatshop clothing made in Third World countries to clothes made from

organic cotton in the U.S. by workers who earn a decent living. We brought along samples of such clothing to show that it is possible to find and buy this kind of clothing in the U.S. We worked with the Union of Needletrades, Industrial, and Textile Workers, the garment workers union.

**Climate Change.** This continued until 2006, when I read another book, *The Revenge of Gaia* by James Lovelock, about Climate Change, and was again so appalled at the prospect of the coming great loss of life, that I decided to focus primarily on Climate Change. I saw the need to inform people about its nature, causes, and consequences, going back to churches and colleges in the same parts of the country, to encourage them to take appropriate actions.

I have been providing up-to-date information about Climate Change regularly to approximately 9,700 people in churches, universities, labor unions, and social justice organizations. In addition to reaching out to Americans, we provide information to a good number of people across the globe. We live in one world, with the same injustices that afflict the United States afflicting the peoples of the entire world, the prime example being Climate Change, which calls for unified action by all of humanity.

Organized Labor and Social Justice Organizations. Climate Change is no different from the other major injustices that afflict our society (nuclear weapons, poverty, racism, vanishing democracy, sexism, destruction of the environment) in one respect: too few people are involved in resolving it. The U.S. as a whole has evolved in many ways since the Constitutional Convention in 1787, but our form of government has failed miserably to change in ways that involve the citizenry in government. Most passively accept what their rulers decree, with calamitous consequences.

Thus this appeal to the members of labor unions and social justice organizations to become knowledgeable and active in the struggle to rescue the world from the coming calamities from Climate Change.







Decades after Jessica Mitford stunned America with vivid accounts of corruption and abuse in the death industry, not much has improved. Families are manipulated into buying expensive goods and services they don't need or want. Prepaid funeral money vanishes into thin air. Body parts are sold on the black market. Eight states force families to pay a funeral director even if they conduct a home funeral with no need for help. But a consumer movement is now awakening, and Americans are asserting their rights over a key part of life, just as they did in the past with the natural childbirth and hospice movements. 

# The Canadian Expedition: Walk to Waken the Nation

Our planet is in a state of total ecosystem breakdown and this is when we learn what being human really means. I am making my way from Calgary to Ottawa to raise awareness about the climate crisis and demand change from our government, so that we can take responsibility for what we've done and make all the difference we still can.

I am a 50-year-old woman with no roots on a disability pension and I refuse to believe humanity will walk quietly into oblivion, taking everything with us. I have spent my life as a weirdo and I'm done trying to fit into boxes... I've been reclaiming my life from my past and from my disabilities for many years now, reconnecting with myself and with the Earth.

Now, I am using my oddness and my greeness to make this journey, because I can, and because I can't live with myself if I don't do what I can to break down the comfort barriers and help waken people to our situation and our responsibilities.

I started walking from Calgary, Saska Alberta, on April 20 of this year, with my service/support dog – world famous climate gypsy puppy, Mr. Myrtle Sir (MMS, a particularly beautiful and dear Jamaican Shepherd with supersonic radar Mogwai ears). With the exception of the few times I hitched a short ride due to injury or similar reasons, I have walked about halfway to our capital, where I will present our prime minister with a gift, a request, a petition, and a piece of my mind.

In person and in my petition, I am asking our political leader to take responsibility. I am making the Extinction Rebellion demands, as follows:

1. That out government tell the truth about the situation we are in;

2. That our government take immediate steps to reduce carbon emissions to net 0 by 2025; and

3. That we have citizens' assemblies to co-govern.

The first demand calls for transparency and honesty. We cannot proceed under a cloud of untruths, ulterior motives, and lack of accountability or clear responsibilities and possibilities. We need our government to not just toss out an empty declara-



> tion undermined by new pipelines, but to truly acknowledge that the planet and all on it are in a state of total ecosystem breakdown, that we caused this, and that we can still make some small difference – enough that some life will continue on this planet, and that its healing can begin.

> We need our government to acknowledge its own responsibility for the state we are in, for allowing greed (in the form of economics and politics) to take precedence over life itself.

The second demand includes addressing all possible facets of the total systems breakdown and now escalating exponentially around us. Cutting emissions to 0 so quickly will be mindbogglingly hard but we no longer have the option of comfortable ways to change. The IPCC report last fall (October 2018), and ensuing articles with more realistically brief allowances for possibility, leave no doubt that we simply have to quit. Now.

This will entail not only incredible difficulty for all, and much loss, but total changes in culture, lifestyle, governance... absolutely everything. The third demand will work to ensure that these changes happen, and continue. With a process like the sortition process used in Ireland (sortition is the selection process... a bit like how potential jurors are selected... rather than who has deeper pockets and 'better connections') – a representational body of the people will be a bridge until we have time to change how governance works, because although that is necessary, we simply don't have time for that right now.

All we have time for right now is changing the world, and the way we live with it.

On a daily basis, this Expedition shows me again and again how very possible all of this is. I see the innate goodness of human beings constantly and ongoingly. I hear their fears and confusion and hopes and broken hearts. I believe that we are good, that we are waking up, that we can and will reconnect with our world and our responsibility to her. I believe in what we are and can become and can do. I want us to waken to that, across this nation and around ld.

the world.

And I do see people waking up to our situation... some already are before I meet them, some because I've met them. I've had an entire family come out to the highway after I left a town, to tell me they'd been reading and learning all night... they were so scared, and I felt so awful to have handed them such a can of worms, but we do all need to know, in order to be able to rise up against our own extinction. They were grateful to be learning truths, so they can learn to be part of the change.

In another town, a table full of truck drivers who didn't believe in the climate crisis and refuse to talk about that kind of thing ended up talking about it anyways for over an hour, and as far as I know, they still are.

A self-professed redneck began by telling me it's all a pile of hooey... 20 minutes later, after regaling me with tales of calves, and even this year a small cow, being found dead in trees because of the incredible wind storms, he sent me off to give our government hell because this isn't right.

At one stop, a large angry retired man Expedition continued on next page

came over to me to tell me how stupid my scooter is, because it doesn't use either gas or electricity. He got even angrier about my mission. When he ran out of cusses and stomped off across the parking lot, his meek and quiet wife spoke up – "I don't give a f\*\*\* what you believe! What about our children!?" I'd be happy to bet that family, and town, are still talking about the responsibility we have to put aside our own ideas for the sake of what is right.

I'm trying to create ripples, to spread awareness, to plant seeds. I'm trying to waken people to the direness of our situation, but also to give them possibilities. I send them to look up various articles and groups that can help. I send them to each other. I send them to Extinction Rebellion, to TreeSisters, to whatever resources seem appropriate for them to learn and to build on. I try to talk about ways we can change how we live, in large scale ways and in ways close to home. We talk about how to live differently, and the value of what is simple and real.

This isn't just for the purpose of this Expedition. I do live as greenly as I can. I have never had a license or gas vehicle. I do my best to make nutritional and lifestyle choices that respect our Earth.

Travelling means compromises – I can't

carry the weight of food as I had initially intended to, so there are French fries and salads and eggs in truck stop diners, and whatnot. But for the most part, and as much as I possibly can, life is still simple and green on the road.

While travelling, Mr. Myrtle and I mostly camp, or are guests in graciously opened homes. We've had to take a room more than once, and there's been all kinds of issues and even trouble along the way. I am doing this with constant pain due to my disabilities. I navigate C-PTSD, anxiety, panic, agoraphobia, and more as I navigate these roads. Many things have been stolen.

But I wouldn't hurt less if I were doing nothing, I'd just hurt differently, plus I'd be angry and frustrated and useless, so here I am.

Here, for now, is Winnipeg, Manitoba. I've been on pause a few weeks and will be for maybe a few more. It turns out (backed by extensive personal research and consultation) that Mr. Myrtle and I cannot walk the decrepit Ontario highways with turning into roadkill, so I am looking into every alternative and eco-friendly way to continue from here...

I could walk to the Ontario border, but then I'd be stuck there, hitch hiking with MMS and this whole little caravan of ours...not a viable plan. So, I am working on manifesting a way to at least Barrie, Ontario, where I could start walking again.

Meanwhile, I've also finally written this piece, which Iona honoured me by requesting several weeks ago and which I've been remiss about providing. Thank you, Iona, for your patience and for caring so much and doing all you do, and for allowing me to be a small piece of it in this way.

And now I shall return to figuring things out... this Expedition will continue, one way or another, or probably a few ways pieced together... that's all any of us can do right now, is to simply choose to keep following the best road we can...because now, we really do have everything to lose, and our own future to gain.

# Brazil's President Bolsonaro's Legal Bonfire Fuels Amazon Inferno

Amazonia, globally important, is losing its protection through the actions of Brazil's government.

Brazil's president has destroyed the protection enacted by his predecessors, leaving an Amazon inferno to torch the rainforest.

SÃO PAULO, Brazil – The dry season in Brazil is only just beginning, but fires are raging throughout the rainforest, leaving an Amazon inferno and heavy palls of sooty smoke engulfing towns and cities.

The images of huge patches of Earth's largest tropical forest being reduced to charred ashes and blackened tree stumps have alarmed the world as the planet's biggest carbon sink is transformed instead into a source of carbon emissions.

President Jair Bolsonaro, who has deliberately weakened public policies which were in place to protect the rainforest and punish illegal loggers and farmers, tried to blame NGOs and indigenous peoples for the fires.

His foreign minister, Ernesto Araujo, decided it is all a leftwing plot to destroy Brazil.

The truth is less exotic. All the evidence points to the fires, many inside protected areas and national parks, being deliberately started by land grabbers, ranchers, and farmers, to claim the land, once cleared of forest, as theirs.

#### The Amazon is our common good.

Encouraged by the president's openly pro-development, anti-environment agenda, they are so confident that they will not be punished that in one small Amazon town, *Novo Progresso*, the local paper published a call by local farmers for a "Day of Fire" with the declared aim of showing Bolsonaro they were ready to open up the land for agriculture.

The day chosen was August 10. The following day INPE, the government's institute for space research, which monitors the Amazon daily, recorded an explosion of fires, with over 200 in the immediate area, including some in the Jamanxim national forest and the Serra do Cachimbo nature reserve, both protected areas.

INPE recorded over 72,000 fires all over Brazil during the first seven months of this year. The INPE system of deforestation alerts in real time, Deter, showed an increase of 278% over the year before. From August 2018 to July 2019 it showed a total of 6,833 square kilometers (4,246 square miles) of cleared forest, up from 4,572 square kilometers (2,841 square miles) between August 2017 and July 2018.

When confronted with these statistics, instead of taking steps to halt the fires and the deforestation, Bolsonaro declared the numbers were "lies" and forced the director, Ricardo Galvão, a highly respected scientist, to resign.



biggest metropolis, on Monday, August 19, turning day into night.

Scientists, with the aid of satellite images from NASA, concluded that the cloud came from fires in Brazil's mid-west and north, as well as from neighboring Bolivia and Paraguay.

INPE researcher Saulo Ribeiro de Freitas, quoted by FAPESP, São Paulo's scientific research institute, said that the mass of polluted air generated by the fires in these areas was pushed to a height of 5,000 meters (three miles) by the winds blowing from east to west, from the Atlantic to the Pacific, until they hit the Andes mountains.

Then the air was blown south by the anticyclone system. De Freitas explained that, "The convergence of this mass of polluted air coming from the north with a cold front coming from the south" produced "a river of soot which mingled with other pollutants in the atmosphere, like carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide, ozone, nitrous oxide, and methane, to form a smog."

For the first time, inhabitants of São Pau-

lo were feeling the direct impact of the Amazon fires, over 2,000 miles away. Even so, it took the government several more days before it reacted, ordering Air Force planes into the air to spray water, and boosting local firefighting teams with units of the national guard.

#### **Forest Defenses Sabotaged**

This belated action was triggered by the international repercussions, with the Amazon fires making their way onto the agenda of the G7 meeting in Biarritz, thanks to French president Emmanuel Macron, who said, "The Amazon is our common good."

France has a physical stake in the Amazon region because of French Guiana, officially a regional department of France. Nine countries include a part of the Amazon basin in their territories.

It is not the first time that the G7 has put the Amazon and its role in global warming on its agenda. In 1991 it established a U.S. \$250-million Pilot Programme (PPG7) for the preservation of tropical forests in Brazil, which funded the demarcation of indigenous reserves and sustainable development projects.

More recently, Norway and Germany set up the Amazon Fund to prevent, monitor, and combat deforestation through grants to local authorities and NGO projects. Due to interference by the environment minister, Ricardo Salles, who tried to discredit the NGO projects, Norway and Germany have suspended some of their funding, leaving local authorities without the money for firefighting activities.

Through its own actions, the Bolsonaro government has not only encouraged the assault on the Amazon rainforest, but deliberately sabotaged the public policies put in place by previous governments and other countries to defend it.

# The Arctic: Melting Affects Us All Climate Force Arctic Expedition Report

The Climate Force Arctic (CFA) Expedition to the north polar region was led by Robert Swan, OBE, F.R.G.S, and the first man in history to have walked to both the poles. Climate Force International Director and Robert Swan's illustrious son Barney, who last year became the first person to reach the South Pole powered solely by renewable energy, and The Explorer's Passage Founder Jeff Bonaldi were among the Team Leaders.

The CFA team comprising of 86 scientists, naturalists, corporate leaders, writers, filmmakers, civil society leaders, and other experts from 27 countries first met at Oslo, the 2019 European Green Capital of the Year award-winning city. The acclimatization period included leadership sessions, workshops, and presentations, with David Hone, author and Chief Climate Change Advisor at Shell, leading the discussions on climate change scenarios and solutions.

On the second day, I was invited to deliver an audio-visual presentation about

the proposed Marine Arctic Peace Sanctuary (MAPS) for all marine areas north of the Arctic Circle and make a forceful case for MAPS as an immediate and effective response to today's global ecological and humanitarian crisis. I also talked about the water crisis and the human-wildlife conflicts in India and the challenges for the survival of rhinos, elephants, and tigers.

From Oslo, the CFA team was flown to Longyearbyen, the world's northernmost town, which is located only 800 miles from the North Pole. It was disconcerting to learn that the Svalbard archipelago had warmed by over 5 degree Celsius in the past 20 years, threatening the lifestyles of the people and biodiversity of the region.

At Longyearbyen, the CFA team boarded the National Geographic Explorer expedition ship. The daily schedule was hectic, with interactive presentations on warming impacts in the arctic region interspersed with field visits to various fjords, glaciers, and biodiversity-rich areas. There were zodiac cruises, shore landings, and hikes, kayaking, and wildlife observation trips throughout the expedition.

We experienced 24 hours of daylight, with the sun shining overhead even at midnight. In fact, there was never a moment of darkness during the entire duration of the expedition.

The team was extremely lucky with sightings of Arctic wildlife. Some of the memorable encounters include the Bowhead whale, Beluga whale, Fin whale, Polar Bear, Walrus, Svalbard Reindeer, Atlantic Puffin, Great Skua, Arctic Skua, and Ivory Gull. The CFA team learnt about the changing dynamics of predator and prey interactions in the warming arctic ecosystems from wildlife biologists with decades on research in the polar regions.

My book, *Fin Del Mundo- Lessons from the End of the Earth*, was launched by Robert and Barney Swan during the expedition. The book chronicles my journey from having grown up in a climate-changeimpacted region to the firsthand experi-

ence of warming during the International Antarctic Expedition in 2013.

The CFA team also completed the 'Leadership on the Edge' program curated by Robert Swan, with focuses on environmental leadership development, understanding of the latest climate science, scenarios and country-specific solutions and sustainability education, with onboard sessions with experts and field work in the pristine Arctic.

The entire Arctic region is warming twice as fast as the rest of the planet and scientists say it could be free of sea ice during the summer by 2030. During our visit, we saw several islands where the ice cover was record low. Animals like the seals, walrus, and polar bears were facing survival threats because of the loss of sea ice. Several of the fjords had ice-free spaces and we were told that the volume of ice had shrunk considerably every year.

At 80-degree North, we encountered an endless expanse of sea ice, blocking our passage further into the north polar region. The loss of sea ice is of utmost concern, as it has implications for global weather and is vital for the survival of animals like seals and polar bears. Therefore, the decision to turn back without disturbing the sea ice, even though the National Geographic Explorer is an ice-strengthened vessel capable of breaking through sea ice, was made.

The Arctic ice cools our planet and regulates weather patterns; what happens in the Arctic affects us all, with global impacts on the weather systems. The evidence is clear that the accelerated melting of polar ice is already changing global weather. As a result, a humanitarian crisis is unfolding with floods, droughts, famine, and rising sea levels all over the world. The predicted disruption of the South Asian monsoon due to the accelerated melting of sea ice could be catastrophic for India, which is already facing extreme weather and an unprecedented water crisis.
